Motions That Have No Specific Rank

To disagree with the chair's ruling	"I appeal from the decision of the chair."	YES	YES	YES (if motion is)	NO	Majority (to sustain chair's ruling)	YES
Consider by paragraph or section	"I move the motion be considered by seriatim (paragraph)"	NO	YES	NO	YES	Majority	NO
To revote by rising	"Division" or "I call for division."	YES	NO	NO	NO	Chair Responds	NO
To vote on parts of a motion separately	"I move to divide the question so as to consider . . . separately."	NO	YES	NO	YES	Majority	NO
To avoid consideration of a question (motion) that seems ridiculous or invalid	"I object to the consideration of the . . ."	YES	NO	NO	NO	2/3 (against consideration)	Negative Vote Only
To ask a parliamentary procedure question	"I rise to a point of parliamentary inquiry."	YES	NO	NO	NO	Chair Responds	NO
To ask a question about an issue	"I rise to a point of information."	YES	NO	NO	NO	No vote	NO
To protest a parliamentary infraction or a breach of conduct rule from the floor	"I rise to a point of order."	YES	NO	NO	NO	Chair rules (Except in doubtful cases)	NO
To suspend rules temporarily	"I move to suspend the rules so that.."	NO	YES	NO	NO	2/3	NO
To withdraw one's own motion	"I withdraw the motion" (before stated by the Chair) or "I request permission to withdraw the motion" (after chair has stated motion)	YES	NO (if before stated by the chair)	NO	NO	Majority	NO (unless body votes against withdrawal)

Motions That Bring A Question Before The Assembly

To reconsider a vote on what may have been a hasty action	“I move to reconsider the vote on . . .” (If on prevailing side.)	NO	YES	Only if motion to be reconsidered is debatable	NO	Majority	NO
To nullify a vote previously taken	“I move to rescind the motion previous adopted that (to)”	NO	YES	YES	YES	Majority with previous notice or 2/3	NO (If affirma. vote)
To take up a matter previously tabled	“I move to take from the table the motion relating to”	NO	YES	NO	NO	Majority	NO
