

The cards will be used by the organization to help provide for the women and children in their care. We have included information from CVAN on their services.





Many thanks for reaching out about CVAN's Holiday Program this year – Together, we helped 123 women and children with gifts, food and supplies last year.

Our hybrid Holiday Program, which we developed through the pandemic, actually turned out to have many pluses – giving several options.

Here are ways you can help:

* *Gift Cards*: Instead of buying gifts, you could get gift cards to discount stores like Walmart and Target. With gift cards, Moms can shop directly for their kids and CVAN staff can shop for gifts for Moms, supplies and food.

* Store Shopping: If you prefer to go out and shop off the shelves – we appreciate that too! Just give us a call when you're coming. We have a table outside on the porch to put everything on.

* **Online Shopping:** And online shopping is another option. Items can be shipped directly to our office. Call us for the address.

Wish List: We don't have a specific Wish List. Instead, since we have kids of all ages and genders – just shop like you would for someone you know!

Wrapping Paper: We order it online ahead of time, but feel free to add it with your gifts, if you prefer.

Deadline: Friday 12/8 - but just let us know if you need more time!

Your support helps bring true holiday hope and joy. Last Christmas morning, as her children were squealing with delight, their Mom said to our Advocate – "I never dreamed I could get Christmas for my kids this year, how can I ever thank you for being like family to us."

From January to September - we answered 1,378 calls on our 24-hour Hotline; provided 2,494 nights of Shelter and 9,976 meals; helped 177 former Shelter residents with suppl food and support; and went to court with 120 women seeking restraining orders.

PEP EXPANSION PHASE 2 COMMITTEE UPDATE

The PEP Committee Phase 2 is the reclaiming of disbanded clubs. To date, the committee has been working to identify all the disbanded clubs in each of our districts. The Governors and Executive Committee Representatives (ECR) for the district will be contacted to assist in identifying the last known point of contact for that disbanded club. In addition, we have members of our Phase 2 Committee actively pursuing forming new clubs in the western parts of the United States.

Currently of our 19 districts, we have 9 districts that are below the 250-member charter strength. These 9 districts are the ones we will be concentrating on to get them up to their charter strength. If we are successful in having these districts reach their 250-member strength, we will add an additional 907 members. WE ARE WORKING HARD TO MAKE THIS HAPPEN!! We encourage you to hold recruitment or Share Pilot events this year. If every member and club were to embrace recruitment efforts, and add ONE, imagine the new talent, and support your club will have.
